Swimwear & Safety Requirements

Infant & Toddlers

- Little swimmers or swim diapers are required for all water play days

Pre-School Girls

- One-piece bathing suits only

Pre-School Boys

- Swim trunks only

All Children Must Bring

- Towel
- Water shoes
- Extra clothing
- All items must be clearly labeled with your child's name

For the safety of all children, **open-toe shoes are NOT permitted.**

Sunscreen must be applied in the morning at home.

KidzStuff Transition to Elementary School

All graduating students are eligible to enroll in the KidzStuff Before/After Care program which includes breakfast, snacks, out of school care, and transportation. Space is limited sign up today to secure your 2026/2027 school age spot.

2026 Summer Programming

Summer programming will begin on **June 22, 2026**. All **school agers (5-12)** will enjoy pool days, field trips, sports/games arts/crafts, music, and more from 8:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m.

Before/After care is available, please see the center director for more information.

The school age classrooms will close for a summer reset from June 15th – 19th.

Children can dress summer casual with closed-toed shoes every day of the week. Camp T-shirts are required on field trip days.

Swimming Pool Attire:

The following things are required to participate in pool days. Children who are not properly dressed or prepared for pool days are not able to come to camp on swimming days.

All children need:

1. Towel
2. Spray on Sunscreen
3. Lined swim trunks for boys (no cut off shorts)
4. One piece bathing suits for girls (shorts for traveling to/from the pool)
5. Flip Flops for pool days **ONLY** not to be worn in the center

95% of Friday field trips and pool fees are included in the summer tuition.

Spending money is optional on field trips. We will let you know when the children have opportunities to spend money.

KidzStuff will provide breakfast, morning snacks, and afternoon snacks. Children are required to bring lunch with them to the center. **No peanut products.**

Communicable Diseases

Hand, foot, and mouth disease (HFMD) peaks in summer and early autumn because it feeds on warm weather. It is a highly contagious mild viral illness commonly passed amongst young children under 10 who are in close contact.

The virus spreads very easily in daycares, schools, and homes. It is transmitted through direct contact with saliva, mucus, and fluid from blisters. The virus can live on surfaces for several days, and in shared spaces. Children often touch contaminated items (like toys) and put them in their mouths.

It causes a fever, sore throat, reduced appetite, painful blister-like sores in the mouth, and a rash on the hands, feet, and buttocks, and a general feeling of being unwell. Symptoms typically appear 3 to 5 days after exposure.

People are most contagious during the first week of illness, but they can continue to shed the virus for weeks.

Children who are diagnosed with HFMD are required to remain home until the sores develop scabs and a minimum of 10 days.
